


Latest Polling Shows Biden and Democrats Out of Touch

Biden's Policies Defy Democrat Voters

Since the unprecedented Dobbs leak in early May, liberal groups have engaged in regular protests at the homes of six of the Supreme Court justices. Recently, there was also a protest at Morton's Steakhouse while Justice Brett Kavanaugh was eating dinner.

When presented with the fact that it is against federal law to protest at the homes of Supreme Court justices, over half (58%) of respondents agreed that Attorney General Merrick Garland should enforce this law. Democrats agreed by 11-points (50-39), and Likely Midterm Voters agreed by 29-points (60-31).

Similarly, when probed whether this behavior undermines our democracy, over 6-in-10 (61%) of registered voters agreed that these types of protests undermine our democracy. Independent voters agree by 34-points, while Republicans agree by 50-points, and Democrats agree by 13-points. Over half (54%) of Independent




women and half (50%) of Democrat women think protestor behavior undermines our democracy.

Further, a majority (60%) of the registered voters surveyed **agree** that President Biden should condemn the protests at the homes of Supreme Court justices. Over half (51%) of Democrats surveyed agree that Biden should condemn the behavior, as well as 45% of Liberals.

Violence Isn't Popular

Registered voters were also surveyed on the recent Supreme Court decision overturning *Roe v. Wade* and the subsequent protests headed by activists calling for a "summer or rage." The vast



majority (84%) of registered voters agree that those who engage in acts of vandalism and violence should be prosecuted, including 82% of Democrats. This agreement increases among Moderates to 83%, and sits at 85% among Independent voters.

Similar results were seen when

respondents were tested on whether those acts of violence and vandalism undermines our democracy, with 85% of registered voters agreeing, including 85% of Democrats. Among Independents, over 4-in-5 (82%) agree that engaging in rage, intimidation, and acts of vandalism

or violence undermines our democracy. By 80-points, likely midterm voters agree that these acts undermine our democracy.

Midterm Implications

These results have further implications for elected officials. By 35-points, registered voters are less likely to support elected officials who refuse to speak out against the acts of violence against a pregnancy center. Among Independents, over 6-in-10 (61%) are less likely to vote for someone who refuses to speak out, and Democrats are less likely to vote by 20-points.

Survey Methodology

This survey was conducted online by CRC Research July 14-17, 2022. The sample size was N=1600 Registered Voters, and the margin of error for the survey was \pm 2.45% at the 95% confidence interval. The political affiliation of the respondents included 30% Republicans, 34% Independents, and 36% Democrats.
